The Cremation Process

Cremation is a common form of disposition in the United States. The percentage of cremations to deaths in the United States and Canada has been increasing steadily during the last two decades.

A funeral or memorial service is an important step in helping bereaved families and individuals begin the grieving process, by offering them the opportunity to honor their loved one and to say good-bye. A visitation with a funeral service at a church or funeral home are options that should be considered. Services may happen with the deceased present - embalmed and prepared, then cremated - or with their urn displayed.

Crematories require the use of an appropriate casket or cremation container to hold the body of the deceased in the furnace or retort.

Cremated bodies do not have the appearance or chemical properties of ashes; they are primarily bone fragments. Cremated remains weigh from three to nine pounds, depending on the loved one's size. The cremated remains are then placed in an urn of the family's choosing.

There are several options for disposition of cremated remains. They may be placed in a niche at a columbarium which is designed to hold cremated remains. They may be kept in the home or buried in a cemetery. Some cemeteries require the use of an urn vault; the funeral home will have that information. Families should choose a disposition option that best fits their emotional needs.

The Traditional Burial Process

Traditional funerals can have differences, but all have the same basic structure.

A wake, or visitation, allows people the opportunity to share their sympathies and condolences. There may not be an opportunity to have the chance to do this during the actual funeral ceremony. The body of the deceased will be present in a casket that is either closed or open. Usually, people say a short prayer by the casket and then proceed to share their condolences.

The funeral ceremony will pay tribute to the life of the deceased, reflect on the impact he/she made, and to say a final "goodbye." Often, the funeral ceremony is held at a funeral home, church, or at a cemetery. Funeral ceremonies will include liturgy or religious passages being read, hymns being sung, and the eulogy will be given as well.

Once the funeral service has ended, there may be a vehicle procession to the cemetery. Once at the cemetery, the family and guests gather around the plot or mausoleum. At this point, a final set of prayers, referred to the Rite of Committal, is recited.

Many families decide to have a social gathering after the committal service with food and refreshments. This gives a chance for the family to thank guests for attending and allows everyone to share memories and provide support for each other.

A FUNERAL PRE-PLANNING GUIDE

Planning ahead can be of great benefit to you and those you love. Death is never easy. First, there may be denial that a death has occurred. Later, there may be anger, thoughts of “if only...” depression, and finally acceptance of the fact that a life has been lived. Suppression or denial of the grief process may increase the time required for acceptance to occur.

The earlier survivors accept a death, the better in emotional terms of healing. Visitation with an open casket can help to hasten acceptance. By seeing the loved one’s body in a casket, survivors realize that the death is real, and that it has occurred. The support offered by friends and relatives during visitation, funeral, and burial has stood the test of time in assisting families dealing with their grief.

Some people may think that they are doing their friends and family a favor by saying, “Don’t make a fuss over me”. However, experience shows that your funeral may be the greatest, most loving gift you will ever give those who love you. It helps them say goodbye in a healthy, positive way.

A vital part in preparation is making your final wishes and desires known to those you love. After a death, survivors are often forced by lack of information to guess what the deceased would have wanted.

They may struggle with feelings of guilt for years afterward, worrying that in some way, they may not have carried out the last wishes of their loved one.

A way to spare your survivors this frustration is to take the time now to consider and write down your final wishes and desires. They will then be able to use the information you supply to be sure your chosen way is

adhered to. You can consider your “Funeral Pre-Planning Guide” booklet to be a very private first step in the funeral planning process, or you can use it as the foundation upon which you build your pre-arrangement plan. Your Funeral Director can assist you in deciding how far you wish to go in the planning process. The Director can also show you the various types of caskets and vaults available. There is a large

selection of style, material, and cost, and your loved ones will appreciate knowing your preferences.

When your booklet is completed, you will need to decide where to keep it. You may want to give it to your spouse, an adult child, a trusted friend, or the person you have selected to be in charge of your final affairs. There are many potential storage places to consider. Home safe, fireproof document box, desk, etc., have all been used. You may even want to leave it

with your attorney. Whatever you decide, it is important to make sure that someone close to you knows where it is. That person should be a family member or friend who will be among the first notified of your death. Make sure that the place you choose for safe keeping is easily available at a moment’s notice. A safe deposit box is not recommended because there may be a lengthy delay before it can be legally opened.

Please take the time to fill out your booklet now, while you are thinking of it. A little bit of effort on your part today will help your loved ones face a difficult time in the future.

RECIPIENT MAY SET ASIDE FOR FUNERAL AND BURIAL EXPENSES

1. \$4,500 irrevocable burial trust for funeral services. (Permitted under the burial fund exclusion).
2. An irrevocable or revocable trust for the purchase of a casket. (Permitted under the burial space exclusion).
3. An irrevocable or revocable trust for the purchase of a burial vault. (Permitted under the burial space exclusion).
4. \$1,500 face value life insurance policy. Subject to Estate Recovery.
5. \$2,000 in other liquid resources.

Comments:

Under Wisconsin Law, a funeral home may be party to only one irrevocable trust agreement, which can include the casket and burial vault purchases.

If a revocable trust is preferred for the purchase of a casket and burial vault, the proceeds from these purchases may be placed in one revocable trust.

Since August 2014, the use of one irrevocable trust for the prepayment of funeral services up to \$4,500 and the purchase of a casket and burial vault has been permitted. If one irrevocable trust is used for the prepayment of funeral services and the purchase of a casket and burial vault, the first \$4,500 of the funds deposited will be considered as set aside for funeral services.

There has not been a limit placed on the amount that may be set aside for the purchase of a casket or a burial vault; however, social service workers do have discretion to question the amounts expended on these purchases and to require that other choices be made.

Irrevocable Funeral Trust Agreement for _____

The first \$4,500 of funds deposited under this agreement must be used for the funeral of the Depositor. In addition Depositor may make any dividends and/or interest irrevocable and used for Depositor's funeral. This Irrevocable Funeral Trust Agreement is made by the undersigned Depositor to set forth in advance some arrangements of a funeral service for the Depositor to be provided by the undersigned Funeral Home. A copy of the Funeral Home's Statement of Funeral Goods and Services selected for these arrangements is attached. In consideration of their mutual promises, and in accordance with section 445.125, Wis. Stats. as may be amended from time to time, the Depositor and Funeral Home agree:

The Depositor reserves the right to amend this agreement subsequently in writing to change any details of the funeral and final disposition specified here provided that the Funeral Home may then adjust the cost of the funeral service accordingly. The Depositor reserves the sole right to designate another funeral home by written notice to the Funeral Home and Depository given prior to the Depositor's death, or to make any changes herein as may be permitted or required by federal or Wisconsin statutes, judicial or administrative interpretations.

_____ Funeral Home pursuant to this agreement and s. 445.125, Wis. Stats. The intent of the Depositor is to designate the first \$4,500 of the funds deposited pursuant to this agreement as an irrevocable funeral trust fund, which must be used for the funeral and final disposition of the Depositor. The Depositor, his/her heirs, personal representative or other person may add or authorize any additional amount to the cost of this funeral. The Depositor further directs that any dividends and/or interest earned on the fund shall be distributed as follows (check one):

- _____ Made Irrevocable and added to the minimum amount to be deposited {E} and used for the Depositor's funeral.
- _____ Withdrawal by Depositor upon demand, but if not withdrawn added to the minimum amount to be deposited {E} and also used for the Depositor's funeral.

Before his/her death the Depositor, after written notice to the Funeral Home, may withdraw any portion of the principal deposited in excess of \$4,500, provided that no interest and/or dividends also made irrevocable is ever withdrawn by the Depositor, if the amount held in the funeral trust account at the time of the Depositor's death, together with any additions from others, is no less than the minimum amount to be deposited {E}, the Funeral Home shall: provide a funeral service for the Depositor for the amounts designated above as {A} (and {B} and {C}, if a part of this Agreement); and arrange for the services and/or merchandise to be furnished by others, if the obligation of the Funeral Home is limited to the amount designated above in {D}. If the minimum amount designated above {E} is not on deposit at the time of the Depositor's death, the obligation of the Funeral Home is limited to providing services and merchandise, if any, as may then be purchased with the accumulated trust account, together with any additions by others, upon the death of the Depositor.

The Funeral Home in its discretion may request the counsel of _____ when making the actual arrangements for the funeral and final disposition of the Depositor. After Depositor's death, Depository is authorized to distribute to the Funeral Home the amount of its statement, including the balance of the account, upon being furnished a written confirmation by the Funeral Home that it has complied with the provisions of the agreement, and a certified copy of the Depositor's death certificate. Any excess in the account shall be remitted to the Depositor's estate. In the event the Funeral Home declines or is unable to comply with this agreement, the Depository is authorized to disburse the entire balance of the account to the Depositor's estate upon being furnished appropriate evidence of the Depositor's death and the inability of the Funeral Home to comply with this agreement. The Depository may disburse funds from the account in accordance with this agreement in absolute reliance upon representation made and documents furnished by the person requesting withdrawal. The Depository shall incur no liability for relying upon such evidence. In no event may the Depository's total liability under this agreement exceed the amount deposited in the account plus accrued dividends and/or interest.

This agreement benefits and binds the successors, assigns, heirs, and personal representatives of the Depositor, Funeral Home and Depository.

TAX WITHHOLDING CERTIFICATE: Under penalties of perjury, the depositor certifies (1) that the Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) shown on this form is the depositor's correct TIN, (2) that the depositor is not subject to backup withholding either because the depositor has not been notified that the depositor is subject to the backup withholding as a result of a failure to report all interest and dividends, or the Internal Revenue Service has notified the depositor that the depositor is no longer subject to backup withholding and (3) that the depositor is a U.S. person (including a U.S. resident alien).

TERMS OF PAYMENT AND CREDIT POLICY

When a death occurs in a family, the deceased or their family may or may not have the resources in place at the time of death to cover the funeral expenses. Usual and customary expenses are covered by a life insurance assignment, proceeds from the deceased's estate, or pre-paid funeral plans. If none of these exist, then the responsible party for the arrangements would be responsible for payment.

If no insurance assignment or pre-paid funeral plan is in effect, our terms of payment are 25% down payment on the funeral home charges, unpaid balance paid within 30 days, and charges to third parties or cash advances need to be paid on or before the day of services.

Again, we strongly state that our emphasis as a funeral home is to provide the highest standard of attention, service, and understanding to your family during your loss. In order to do so we need to provide the highest quality staff and facilities to meet your needs, and that is accomplished by remaining strong economically.



GENERAL PRICE LIST

(These prices are effective as of April 1, 2023 and are subject to change without notice.)

The goods and services shown below are those we can provide to our customers. You may choose only the items you desire. However, any funeral arrangements you select will include a charge for our basic services and overhead. If legal or other requirements mean you must buy any items you did not specifically ask for, we will explain the reason in writing on the statement we provide describing the funeral goods and services you selected.

I. Services of Funeral Director and Staff, Facilities and Equipment:

- 1. BASIC SERVICES OF FUNERAL DIRECTOR AND STAFF (NON-DECLINABLE) \$2295
 Our fee for the basic services of funeral director and staff includes, but is not limited to, staff to respond to initial request for service; arrangement conference with family or responsible party; arrangements; preparation and filing of necessary authorizations and permits; recording vital statistics; preparation and placement of obituary notices; staff assistance prior to, during and following the service, including coordination with those providing other portions of the service, e.g. cemetery, crematory and others. Also included in these charges are overhead expenses relative to our facilities such as sheltering of remains, professional licensing, legal and accounting fees, insurance, building and utility expenses, parking lot and grounds, maintenance, taxes, equipment, furnishings, inventory costs, recordkeeping, and secretarial and administrative expenses. This fee for our basic services and overhead will be added to the total cost of the funeral arrangements you select. (This fee is already included in our charges for direct cremations, immediate burial, and forwarding or receiving remains.)
- 2. EMBALMING \$695
 Except in certain special cases, Embalming is not required by law. Embalming may be necessary, however, if you select certain funeral arrangements, such as a funeral with viewing. If you do not want embalming, you usually have the right to choose an arrangement that does not require you to pay for it, such as direct cremation or immediate burial.
- 3. OTHER PREPARATION OF THE DECEASED
- Includes cosmetology, dressing and casketing \$375
- Washing/Disinfecting of remains when there is no embalming \$195

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4. USE OF FACILITIES AND STAFF FOR VIEWING/VISITATION per day \$450*
Our services include set-up of visitation area, placement of the encased remains, display of floral arrangements, supervision of and attendance during the visitation OR if facilities are not used the additional time, staff and equipment necessary for conducting the gathering off premises.
